### *Potpourri*

The Punjab Public School has taken a quantum leap over the last two months or so. The recent rankings released by the Education World has ranked PPS No. 9 Co-ed Boarding School of the country and No. 1 in Punjab. On vital parameters of sports, infrastructure, leadership and co-curricular activities, PPS is rated in top 10 in the country. The school is ranked 7th in Sports Education and 9th in Community Service. The Education World Award with Certificate was presented to Dr Jagpreet Singh at The Leela Ambience, New Delhi on September 23, 2017. Besides, a special cash prize of Rs 100,000/- with a trophy was also given to him for being the Most Promising School of India.

Secondly, we achieved yet another milestone by organising the first ever ICT Conclave in July. 10 teams from the prestigious schools of the country took part. Of the five competitions held during the Conclave, PPS shared the first slot with Pinegrove School, Solan in My Innovation Competition and were second in Robo Soccer.

Thirdly, the school organised the JK Kate Memorial All India Inter-School Knowledge Conclave in August in which 21 top schools of the country took part. The team from Pinegrove School, Dharampur lifted the JK Kate Memorial All India Inter-School Knowledge Conclave trophy. The next version of the event will be Super-7 with the addition of Wall Magazine Competition.

Fourthly, the performance of our boys and girls in the All India IPSC Hockey Boys (U-19) and Girls (U-17) Championship organised on our campus in July has been phenomenal. Besides, the boys' hockey team were runners-up in the IPSC (U-17) Boys Hockey Championship organised at Mayo College, Ajmer from September 9-11, 2017. Guryadwinder Singh was adjudged the Best Defender of the tournament. Our boys' hockey team defeated SAI Sports Centre, MP9-3 during the Steelbird Helmet 35th Nehru Junior Hockey Tournament (U-15). Himmat Singh of PPS was adjudged the Man of the Match and was also presented with a hockey stick.

Finally, the school is gearing up for the 78th IPSC Principals' Conclave to be organised in the first week of December. The theme of the Conclave is Positive Progressive Partners  $\square$  - Soaring towards Excellence. The Conclave, with refreshing speakers and challenging sessions, promises to ignite a new spark in the leaders for a meaningful evolution towards excellence. Principals from all 80 member schools of the IPSC are expected to attend. It will be a big showcase event for us where we will be setting new benchmarks as far as organisational finesse is concerned.

## From the Headmaster's Desk



Students of Class-XII visited Navjivani, the school for children with special needs. Founded in rented quarters with one (1) student in 1982, the school now sits pretty in the well maintained infrastructure. It has 165 students on its rolls with 45 boarders. Nearly 3 per cent of the world's population is mentally challenged. In developing countries, this figure is even higher owing to malnutrition. Shaking a leg with students in dance class, stroke at carom, playing volleyball in the ground, enjoying swings and cycling were part of our interactive activities where we saw the world from their perspective. The day wound up with an interactive session with Mr NS Sodhi, the force behind this institution who has devoted 36 years of selfless service. Dr Jagpreet Singh, Headmaster and Mr Rakesh Alfred, Deputy Headmaster were also present.

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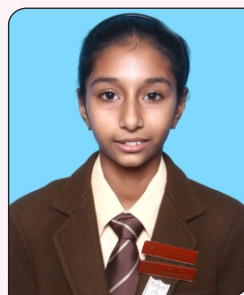

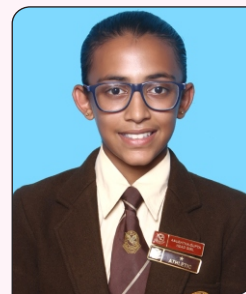

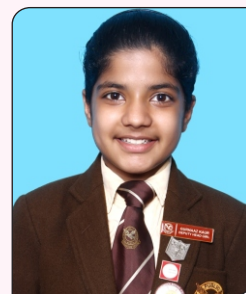
