From the Headmaster's Desk



Kanwar Sandhu (J-106) joined the school in 1964 and passed out in 1970. While in school, Kanwarjit excelled in various sports, especially athletics and gymnastics. Besides, he regularly took part in extra-curricular activities like debates and dramatics.

Later, he went on to represent the state of Punjab in athletics in Inter-State Athletics and National Meets for a number of years. After his post-graduation in English Literature, he joined the exciting field of journalism. In fact, he showed tremendous interest in writing while in school and his articles appeared regularly in the School Chronicle and Potpourri, as the School Magazine was known.

As a journalist, he held various top editorial positions. He was among the youngest editors in the country when, at the age of 38, he was appointed the Resident Editor of *The Indian Express* in Chandigarh. He later became the Editor of *The Hindustan Times* in Chandigarh from 2000 to 2009. He ventured into television journalism and was appointed Director and Managing Editor of Day & Night News, a post he held till 2013. He was appointed Executive Editor of Newspapers, before he joined public life.




He was elected as a Member of the Punjab Legislative Assembly from Kharar Constituency in 2017.

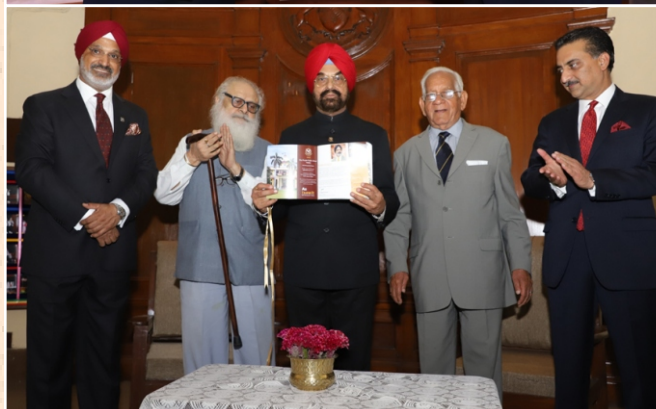
Annual Founders' Day & Prize Giving Function

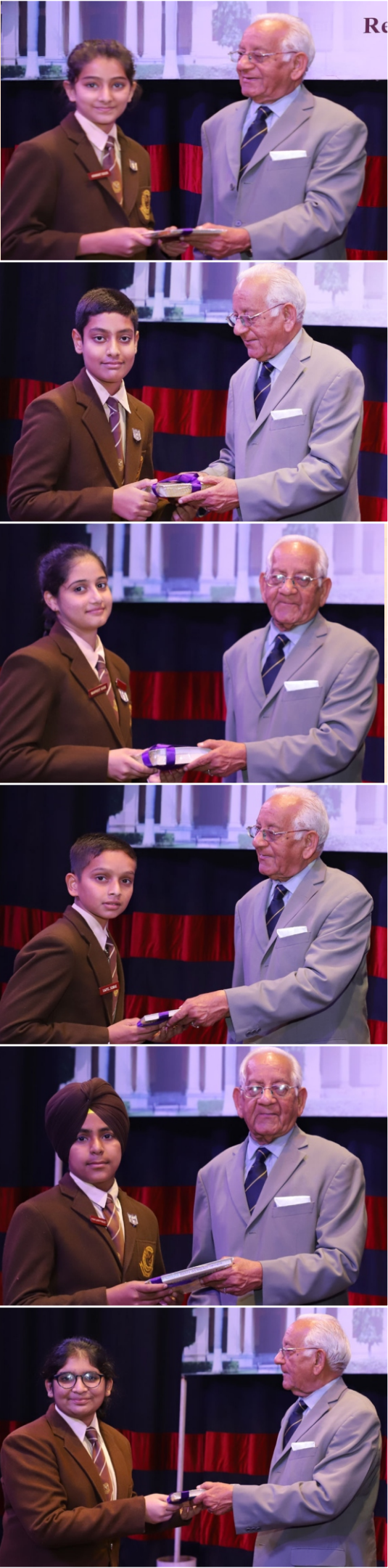

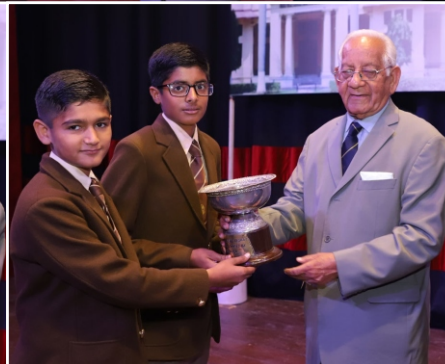

Headmaster's Report (2017-18)

At the outset, I would like to extend a very warm welcome and sincere thanks to our Chief Guest, General Bipin Rawat, UYSM, AVSM, YSM, SM, VSM, ADC, Chief of the Army Staff. I also welcome Mr Sadhu Singh Dharamsot, MLA, Nabha & Cabinet Minister, Punjab, Mr Jai Singh Gill, President Executive Committee of the School Board of Governors, Lt Gen Surinder Singh, AVSM**, VSM, ADC, GOC-in-C, Western Command & Hon'ble Board Members and other Members of the Board of Governors, The Punjab Public School, Mr Kanwar Sandhu, Recipient of the Roll of Honour Award-2018, Mr BS Bhatnagar, Recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award-2018, distinguished guests, parents, Old Nabhaites, my friends from the media and dear staff and students. We are indeed thankful to General Bipin Rawat for having spared time from his busy schedule to be amongst us for our Annual Founders' Day and Prize Giving Function.

General Bipin Rawat is an alumnus of St Edward's School, Shimla and the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla. He was commissioned into the Fifth Battalion, the Eleventh Gorkha Rifles of the Indian Army in December 1978, from the Indian Military Academy (IMA), Dehradun, where he was awarded the 'Sword of Honour'. The officer has vast experience in operations across a wide spectrum of conflict and terrain profiles. He commanded an Infantry Battalion along the Line of Actual Control in the Eastern Sector; a Rashtriya Rifles Sector; an Infantry Division in the Kashmir Valley; and, a Corps in the North East. The officer also commanded a Multi-national Brigade, in a Chapter-VII mission in the Democratic Republic of Congo (MONUC). As an Army Cdr, he commanded a theatre of ops along the Western Front.

General Rawat's staff and instructional assignments include instructional tenure at IMA, Dehradun; General Staff Officer at the Military Operations Directorate; Logistics Staff Officer of a Division in Central India; Colonel Military Secretary and Deputy Military Secretary in the Military Secretary's Branch; and Senior Instructor, Junior Command Wing. He has been Major General, Staff of the Eastern Theatre and the Vice Chief of the Army Staff.

General Bipin Rawat is a graduate of the Defence Services Staff College, Wellington, the Higher Command and National Defence College courses and has attended the Command and General Staff Course at Fort Leavenworth, USA. During a span of over 38 years of service in uniform, the General has been awarded for gallantry and distinguished service with the UYSM, AVSM, YSM, SM, VSM; COAS Commendation on two occasions and the Army Commander's Commendation. Whilst serving with the United Nations, he was twice awarded the Force Commander's Commendation.

Academically inclined, the General has authored numerous articles on 'National Security' and 'Leadership' which have been published in various journals and publications. He was awarded MPhil in Defence Studies from Madras University, and holds two Diplomas, in Management and Computer Studies respectively. General Bipin Rawat completed his research on military media strategic studies and was awarded the Doctorate of Philosophy (PhD) from Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Meerut.

During these 59 years, the school has made its mark among the best residential schools of the country and has also contributed immensely to the civil services, law, politics, media, industry and other professions.

I would now like to make a mention of some of the contributions made by the Old Nabhaites. Besides, Vice-Admiral Satish Soni has also instituted a Cup for the Most Improved Child in Class-XII.

Academics

We once again proved our supremacy in academics by producing excellent results in ICSE and ISC declared by the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), New Delhi in May.

In ISC (Science Stream), Lovepreet Kaur stood first with 94.3% marks followed by Dep Ensu Aggarwal with 93% marks (second) and Mansher Singh and Pranshul Sood with 92% marks (third) respectively. All the 21 students who appeared in the ISC Examination (Science Stream) passed with Distinction.

In ISC (Commerce Stream), Pushpinder Singh and Kazandeep

In ISC, 11 students made the Perfect Score of 100 in Physical Education, 8 students achieved the feat in Political Science and 1 student managed the magic figure in Commerce.

In ICSE, 23 students made the Perfect Score of 100 in Computer Applications.

Remembering Sherjung Singh Chahal



Meticulous but jovial by nature, proclivity to take everything in stride, exuding positivity and guts to laugh at himself while laughing with others were some of the attributes of the persona of Sherjung Singh Chahal alias Sherry an ex-Nabhaite and ex-Head of Geography Department who breathed his last on 25 October 2018 after having battled a fatal disease. As a student at his alma mater, he excelled in whatsoever he had chosen to do including sports, mountaineering, and, creditably, he remained the Head Boy, Athletics Captain and Band Leader. The school had lifted the All India IPSC Athletics Championship trophy under his captaincy in 1983.

Sherjung who joined PPS Nabha as a Geography teacher in 1989 after having obtained

M Sc and M Phil degrees in Geography held various positions there including Housemaster of Middle and Senior Ravi House, Games Master, Head of the Geography Department, etc. As a teacher, he would ensure that his work in the form of syllabus, setting question papers and correction work finished much earlier before the stipulated period. Organising games in a boarding school is of a comprehensive nature and he as a Games Master had handled this arduous task with ease. Being an academician to the core, he also authored books on Geography for school students by spending numerous evenings in the Geography Faculty at PPS Nabha which are being used by students even now in some schools. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award was also conferred on Mr Sherjung Singh Chahal during his school days for excelling in adventurous activities like mountaineering.

He was quite popular with both staff and students and

was a much sought after personality in the Staff Room or at other informal gatherings as he would leave all of us in splits with his narratives and nuggets built up by him spontaneously exhibiting joviality. He could mimic any one on the earth hands down. However, like all human beings, he had a set of disappointments and had vicissitudes of life to cope with that he would wrap up happily and trudge on.

He left PPS Nabha for better prospects to head a prestigious school in Barnala and worked tirelessly

He negotiated numerous odds that came in his way but this time he failed like all mortals to withstand the deadly blow and succumbed to what we call death and when it is to come it comes.

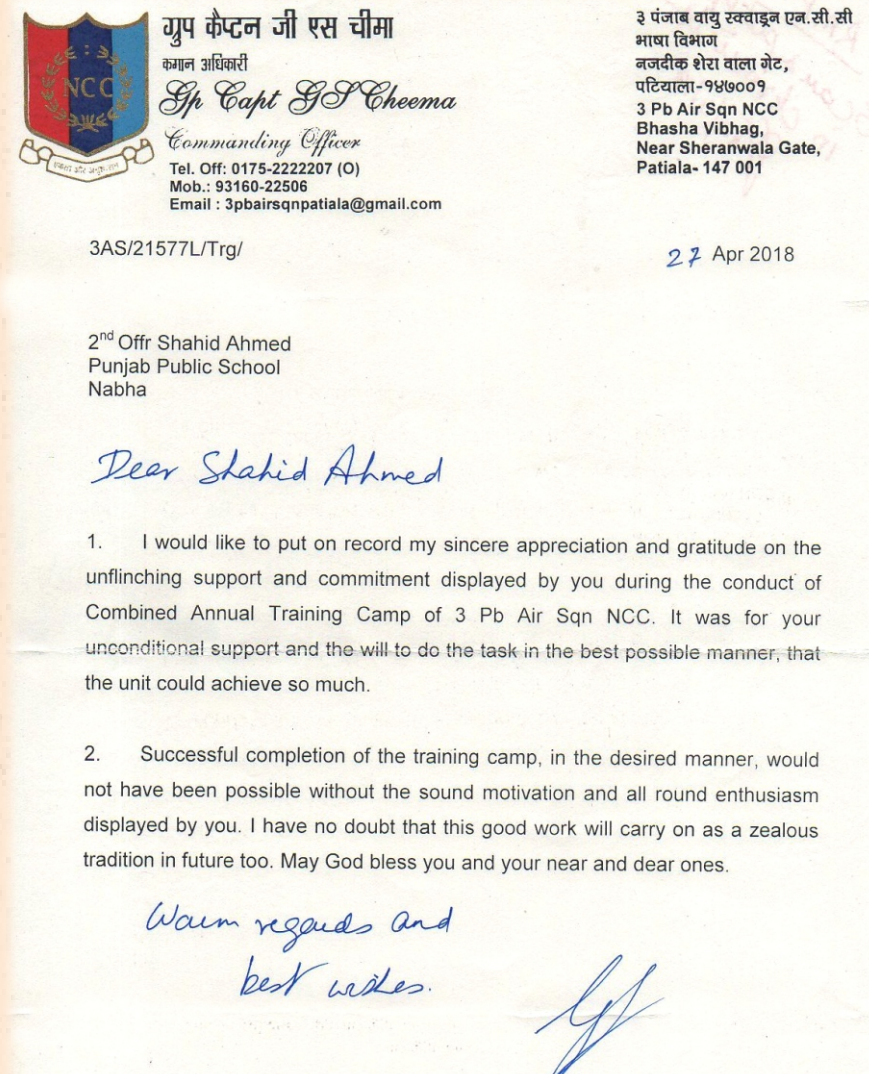

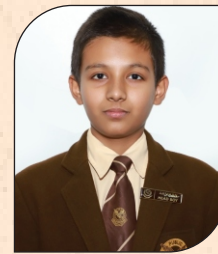

Could I have hard copies of some of my photographs, especially the one in which I have received the award, please? I await these at my Gurugram address.

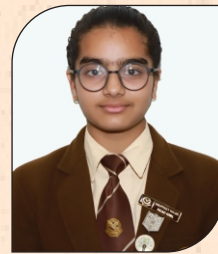
